Bonita (1888) Mike Beckett

Bonita is the oldest surviving Crossfield boat afloat. Owned by the same family since 1937, she took part in a Round Britain Challenge in 2013. Bonita is shortlisted for the 2019 Classic Boat Magazine Awards



Moya (1910) Sabina Sorrentino Tassinari

Moya is based in Greece. In 2017 she featured in an Italian documentary, shortly before her owner Piero Tassinari died at the age of 53. She came second in her class in the 1975 Fastnet Race. Her restoration in Trieste in 1993 won the Martini Rossi award.



Maryll (1938) Keith Watson

Maryll is kept in Holland and is a winner of European award. She has crossed the North Sea and been to the Baltic. Maryll was owned by Jon Wainwright who also owned Deva, one of Severn's sister yachts.



Severn (1912) Alasdair Simpson (Arnside Sailing Club)

Severn is one of 10 Rivers Class Yachts built by Crossfields for the Royal Mersey Yacht Club. She was purchased by Arnside Sailing Club in 2018 with the help of a Heritage Lottery Grant



Arthur Ransome Connection – Mary Hamilton (Arnside Archive Group) Crossfields built Arthur Ransome's Swallow and Coch-y-bonddhu.
